Checklist - Consulting your Celebrant

- Talk to, and meet with, the celebrant.
Are you comfortable for them to officiate your milestone day?
Your celebrant will work with you to achieve the following:

One to eighteen months before your wedding:

1. Complete a 'Notice of Intended Marriage'
2. Lodge the 'Notice of Intended Marriage' with the celebrant
3. Collaborate and craft your ceremony
4. Rehearsal of ceremony (if requested)

One to seven days before your wedding

1. Complete and sign statutory declaration - confirm you are legally able to marry

Wedding day

1. The ceremony takes place
2. Marriage documents signed and witnessed

Notice of Intended Marriage

- To complete a 'Notice of Intended Marriage' you will need -

If your place of birth is within Australia:

- Your original Birth Certificate
- Drivers licence or passport
- original change of name certificate (if any)

If your place of birth is outside Australia:

- Your original Birth Certificate

Note: if not in English, you must obtain a translation of your Birth Certificate from a NAATI accredited translator

- passport
- Original change of name certificates (if any)

Your ceremony plan

Explanation

This ceremony plan shows the structure of a wedding ceremony that has worked well. Typically the components and words required by law are included in the Introduction, Exchange of Vows and Declaration.

Each other section can be customised provided the words and actions are not inconsistent with legal requirements.

A short ceremony can be 10 minutes long. The average ceremony is 20 minutes long. This is followed by 5-10 minutes to sign the marriage documents.

How do I write vows?

A draft ceremony will include the legal words needed, then couples often customise their vows. You don't need to write these yourself, but if you would like to, we provide tips at:

Do I need readings? Can I have song instead?

Readings are optional but the advantage is that it can add to personalise your ceremony and involve friends or a family member.

You can choose an extract from a book, or a poem. If adventurous, sure you can have songs or performances too!
